DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

The **President** shall preside over the business periods of all the meetings of the Fellowship, the Executive Committee, and the Executive Board. She shall also perform such other duties as may be designated by the Executive Board, and shall have general oversight of the work of the Disciples Women's Ministries. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees and will serve on the General Board and Minister's Cabinet as the DWM representative. She shall be empowered to appoint such committees as she feels are necessary.

The **Vice-President** shall be an assistant to the President, and in the absence of the President, assume all the duties of the President; and the Directors, in the order of their election, shall in the absence of the President, assume all the duties of the President. Her main responsibility is to serve as Director of Membership and will be assisted by the Membership Chairman of each circle in seeking to enlist every woman as a member of the Disciples Women's Ministries. She will also supervise over House Maintenance and will provide a schedule for clean-up duties; scheduling a clean-up day once or twice a year, as needed.

The **Recording Secretary** shall keep a roll of the membership of the Disciples Women's Ministries; shall record the proceedings of the regular and executive meetings of the fellowship; shall be the custodian of all contracts, minute books, reports, etc. She shall make such reports to the regular and executive sessions of the Fellowship as the Executive Board shall see fit. At the conclusion of her tenure of office, she shall deliver to her successor such records and documents as may have been acquired.

The **Treasurer** shall see to the collection of offerings and shall keep an itemized record of the same. She shall make remittances of all outreach funds at least quarterly to the Treasurer of the Basic Mission Finance of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and shall disburse all funds for other work as directed by the Executive Board.

The **Director of Worship/Study** shall seek to gain an understanding of the missionary character of Christianity, to learn about worldwide missionary tasks, to accept responsibility for and give generous support to the missionary work of the denomination. This Director will be responsible for planning programs for the quarterly meetings and she shall promote growth in Christian living by observing personal devotions, reading and studying the Bible, using devotional literature, studying stewardship, and making personal commitment. It shall further be the duty of this Director to present the worship and inspirational phases of the Circle and general Meeting and to present a devotional at the monthly board meetings.

The **Director of Service** shall plan and promote projects and activities in: (a) Missions: to provide service gifts for home and foreign mission projects and cooperate in church-wide projects; (b) Community: to unite with women of other churches in planning and carrying out projects of service. To arrange and carry out projects designed to help meet needs in the community; (c) Benevolence: to minister to local relief or social needs and cooperate with the Minister or other church officials who shall be connected with this phase of our church life.

The **Director of Hospitality** shall prepare decorations for DWM dinners and be in charge of the Wassail Bowl.

The principal consideration of the **Department of House Maintenance** will be to help in caring for the church kitchen; laundering all towels, tablecloths, etc. as needed. Each Circle is also responsible to check on the kitchen to make sure it is in good working order. If any purchases are needed, you are to contact the Board for reimbursement/approval. This department shall cooperate with the Church Building Committee and will work in cooperation with the church building Custodian.

The **Chairperson for the General Meetings** is responsible for opening and closing the building, checking that all doors are secure. She will work with the Worship/Study officer for table arrangement and set up. She will call the dishwasher and babysitter to remind them of day and time. She will make sure that all needed supplies are available in the kitchen (coffee, milk, sugar, tea, napkins, etc.). She will oversee the hosting circle and assign jobs.

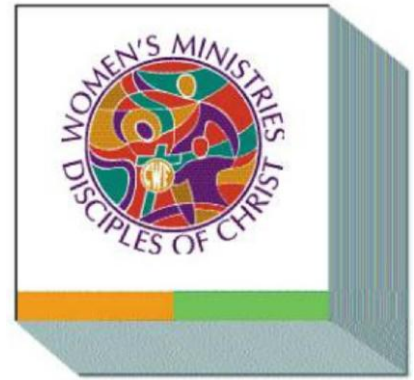
BLESSING BOX CALENDAR

WASSAIL BOWL

Sunday, November 27, 2011
First Sunday in Advent
(Each circle donates 10 dozen cookies.)

WASSAIL BOWL RECIPE

(Serves 100)

INGREDIENTS:

2 gallons apple cider
3 large cans of pineapple
3 large cans orange juice
small bottle real lemon juice
2 cups brown sugar
1 box whole cloves (Tie spices in cheese cloth bag)
1 box stick cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
3 oranges (stud rind with cloves and put cherry in center to float on top of red cherries wassail in punch bowl)

Combine juices, sugar and spices. Heat to a simmer – can then be put in gallon jugs and refrigerated for later use.

SERVING INSTRUCTIONS

Use silver serving pieces.

Place a center-piece on serving table. (Table should be covered with best cloth.)

Place silver nut and mint dishes with serving spoons.

Cover silver trays with doilies and cookies.

Make 1 pitcher of lemonade for children.

DWM RECIPIENT AGENCIES

CAReS, or Community Assistance and Referral Services, provides organized assistance to residents of Boyd County through referrals to other assistance organizations and emergency assistance with utilities and food.

SAFE HARBOR is a local shelter for men, women and children who are victims of domestic abuse.

SHELTER OF HOPE is an emergency, temporary housing facility for families in need. There are eight apartments available. Volunteer Case Workers are assigned to each family to assist them in getting on their feet.

COMMUNITY KITCHEN provides a free lunch for men, women, and children 5 days a week (Monday-Friday). Over 140 persons are being served on a daily basis. Also distributes coats, gloves, hats, and some toys to needy individuals.

UNICEF (United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund) is a relief fund operated through the United Nations for the betterment of children throughout the world. Children annually at Halloween make collections.

SALVATION ARMY provides food, clothing and shelter for families in need in our area and around the world.

First Christian Church maintains a **FOOD PANTRY** from ongoing contributions by our congregation. We provide emergency food orders to five or six families weekly.
